LOTS ABOUT HOTS IN THE NEWS

This year's *Hats Off to Spring Luncheon Fashion Show* fundraiser will be on Wednesday, May 1, 2019 at Ritz Charles. We welcome again *Secret Ingredient* as our fashion provider. We also welcome a **guest emcee** for the event. **Ray Cortopassi** of FOX 59 news will be our master of ceremonies. More about Ray in this Gazette.

Our fundraising efforts are to help the Home purchase the following items: **Oxygen concentrators, beds, vital signs machines (AKA "nurse on a stick"), lockable nightstands, and dining room chairs.** As you can see, the needs are great and this year's HOTS event will offer attendees alternative ways of raising money for the Little Sisters of the Poor. Without a chair for the silent auction, the HOTS planning committee determined that the money historically raised from the silent auction can come from, *with all of your help*, selling out the event again this year, an increase in the number of corporate sponsorships, an increase in the number of Guild patrons, an increase in donations, increased raffle ticket sales, an increase in donations for the Fund-An-Item, and an increase in sales at the Secret Ingredient booth which results in 10% of the sales being donated back to the Little Sisters of the Poor.

Our approach to the raffles is new this year. Instead of donating items for the silent auction, we will be asking the Guild membership to donate a gift card. This will enable us to have multiple gift card trees to raffle off and more opportunities for HOTS attendees to win. We will continue to have our 50/50 raffle. The price for each raffle ticket will be \$5/ticket or \$20 for 5 tickets. This will certainly make the amount of the 50/50 "pot" appealing and worth the price of the ticket! You will be receiving an eblast next week about the processes for donating a gift card and for identifying companies to become sponsors of the 2019 HOTS.

We are very excited to offer the opportunity and ease of making a reservation and/or donation online through the Home's website. We will continue to mail invitations to those on our mailing list. Having online reservation capabilities enhances our expanded publicity by making it easy for the general public to make a reservation or donation.

This year's HOTS will carry on the LSPs "Celebrating 150 Years in America" and we will be sharing more about HOTS with you, the Guild membership, via eblasts and the April Gazette.

Reminder about Reporting Remote Volunteer Hours

The following was published in the October 2018 Gazette and is being reprinted as a reminder:

- 1) During the first week of the month (beginning in November 2018), please send an email to Sara Wissler with the total number of offsite hours you provided **since August 2018**. Sara's email is **sara.wissler2@gmail.com**. If you do not have email, then you call Sara at **(317)** 771-5738 to report your hours.
- 2) Beginning the first week of December 2018, please report your hours to Sara for the previous month of November.
- 3) Continue to report your hours the first week of the month for the previous month's offsite volunteer hours.

4) Sara will manually enter these hours into the Volgistics system. You <u>do not need</u> to report the specific activities you engaged in - only the hours. This need for only the hours has been verified by Pamela Smoot, Volunteer Coordinator at St. Augustine Home. So mark your calendars or set up a reminder to report your offsite hours to Sara Wissler during the first week of every month. The Home benefits from you reporting your volunteer hours.
