Phase Two of Tracking Your Volunteer Hours

On August 3, 2018 you all received information about using the Volgistics system to record your volunteer hours at the Home. The initial rollout of that system has gone well and now we are ready for Phase Two. Phase Two involves recording those volunteer hours you provide for Guild related events that are done outside of St. Augustine Home. Sara Wissler, Pamela Smoot, and Christy Troxell clarified what is needed to report your offsite hours. Here is the process we want Guild members to use when they have offsite hours to report:

- 1) During the first week of the month (beginning in November 2018) please send an email to Sara Wissler with the total number of offsite hours you provided **since August 2018**. Sara's email is **sara.wissler2@gmail.com**. If you do not have email, then you call Sara at **(317)** 771-5738 to report your hours.
- 2) Beginning the first week of December 2018, please report your hours to Sara for the previous month of November.
- 3) Continue to report your hours the first week of the month for the previous month's offsite volunteer hours.
- 4) Sara will manually enter these hours into the Volgistics system. You do not need to report the specific activities you engaged in only the hours. This need for only the hours has been verified by Sara Smoot, Volunteer Coordinator at St. Augustine Home.

So mark your calendars or set up a reminder to report your offsite hours to Sara Wissler during the first week of every month. The Home benefits from your reporting of volunteer hours.
